John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. JN 1:35-36

From the Pastor

Come and See

"Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see."

This passage from today's Gospel, along with the First Reading about Samuel, provides the fundamental way we grow in holiness: Presence. So many times, Jesus or His apostles invite others to simply "come and see." Despite doubts, manifold obligations, and tempting diversions, being in the very presence of Christ seems to put all other things into perspective, shield us from harm, and nullify temptation. Just the simple act of disposing ourselves to Him, setting aside our preoccupations and busyness and allowing ourselves to talk to Him, sit with Him, and listen to Him is everything!

"Speak, for your servant is listening," the prophet Samuel says today. What if God isn't expecting us to be perfect, or to perform remarkable feats, or to save ourselves? What if He essentially wants us to want Him, to want to be with Him? What if He wants to save us through companionship, through friendship with Him? Could the spiritual life be that simple? "Come, and you will see."

Fr. Cook Away

If all goes according to plan, I, Fr. Cook, will be away from the parishes on my annual ski vacation with brother priests from today, Sunday, January 14th through Saturday, January 20st, 2024. I will be back in time for Sunday Masses on January 21st, I am grateful to Fr. Weidner for filling in during my absence.

I say "according to plan" because, as you may have noticed recently, I have not fully been myself these last few weeks. Starting December 23rd, I began experiencing spontaneous dizzy spells, accompanied by profusive sweating and pronounced nausea. The left side of my face consistently tingles and feels numb. These episodes seem to happen when I am standing for a pronounced period of time, like celebrating Mass. It isn't the classic vertigo that I know many of you have suffered from, but it is like it. When it happens, the whole world seems like it is sliding and me with it. I grab on to anything or sit down and hope it will pass. Sometimes it does abate after a few minutes; other times, it persists throughout the day. It's been recurring almost daily and sometimes many times in a day to the point of being almost debilitating.

I have seen various physicians, and they are trying to figure out what it is. At the time of writing this, I am beginning two new medicines that are supposed to help, especially if the cause is some kind of inner ear migraines. I am also undergoing an MRI. If my situation gets better, I'll be skiing. If not, I'll still go on vacation and at least rest but without the slopes: I don't need to have any of these episodes while moving at high velocities.

I thank you for your patience with me and for your extra care and prayers these last few weeks and especially while I am away. I would love to be rid of these episodes, but I also place them at God's disposal: May He do with me what He will. I will be praying for you all during my vacation and in my daily Masses, and please pray for Fr. Weidner and the staff bearing my load in my absence.



The walk recalls the Jan. 22, 1973, Roe v. Wade decision by the U.S. Supreme Court that established a right to abortion across the United States. That decision has since been overturned, but the Nebraska Walk for Life and other pro-life events across the country continue, to remember the millions of lives lost because of abortion.

Archbishop George J. Lucas will celebrate a 9 a.m. Mass before the walk at St. Mary Church, 1420 K St. in Lincoln.

Msgr. Thomas Fucinaro, pastor of the Cathedral of the Risen Christ in Lincoln, will deliver the homily at the Mass, hosted by the Nebraska Catholic Conference.

Worshipers can then head across the street to the Nebraska State Capitol, where the Walk for Life, organized by Nebraska Right to Life, begins at 10 a.m. on the north steps.

The walk will conclude at the Nebraska Union at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, 1400 R St. There participants will find pro-life vendors, refreshments and fellowship. Melissa Ohden, founder of the Abortion Survivors Network, will be keynote speaker.

Ohden, of Kansas City, Missouri, will also speak the night before, Jan. 26, at a 6 p.m. Walk for Life Gala at the Cornhusker Marriott Hotel in Lincoln. Individual tickets for the benefit dinner cost \$60. Tickets for tables of eight are \$480.

Pro-abortion groups want voters to enshrine a right to abortion <u>until birth</u> in the Nebraska constitution, according to proposed language released Wednesday for a possible 2024 ballot initiative.

"This proposal is a fundamental attack on human life and should be categorically rejected by Nebraskans," said Tom Venzor, executive director of the Nebraska Catholic Conference.


