

While Jan's parents set the example of faith in the home, Jan feels like her faith came alive when Fr. Mario Rapose, her pastor at St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament Parish, invited her to participate in the Alpha program and retreat. Fr. Mario was in her small group and, on one occasion, prayed over her and the whole group, laying his hands upon them, and she felt the burning love of the Holy Spirit. Even earlier, during Fr. Loecker's tenure as pastor, Jan desired to be in a deeper relationship with Jesus and adopted an hour of weekly Eucharistic Adoration that she still enjoys on Wednesdays from 8 until 9 p.m. She felt the pull to use her speaking talents to become a Lector and later discerned the call to be an EMHC.

Most recently, Jan accepted the invitation to enter the Archdiocesan Mentorship Program. The Mentorship Program has been lifechanging for her: Learning how to pray, how to pray with Scripture, spending a lot more time with Scripture, has brought Jan's relationship with God to a new level. 




