

From the Pastor

The Octave of Easter

Today we celebrate the 2nd Sunday of Easter known as the Octave of Easter (the eighth day of Easter). Every day this past week through today has been an extension of Easter Sunday itself; as a result, it is most fitting that we still wish everyone today a Happy Easter! As we enter the liturgical season of Easter Time for the next 42 days, let our final singing of the double Alleluia at the conclusion of our Masses today reach Heaven itself: Alleluia! Alleluia!

Divine Mercy

Today is also Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a day of great rejoicing because our Lord promised to St. Faustina Kowalska that on this day "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened" (*Divine Mercy in my Soul: The Diary of Sr. M. Faustina Kowalska*, §699).

Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to Confession and then receive Him in Holy Communion on the Feast of His Mercy, now called Divine Mercy Sunday throughout the Catholic Church. Jesus promised that "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (*Diary*, §699). He went on to say, "I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy" (*Diary*, §1109)." "It is allowed for one to go to Confession up to about 20 days, before or after Divine Mercy Sunday."

Solemnity of the Annunciation

Tomorrow, Monday, April 8th is the Solemnity of the Annunciation. Wait a minute: Wasn't Jesus born on December 25th. Counting backwards nine months, shouldn't His conception be celebrated on March 25th? Because of the primacy of every day of Holy Week and the Octave of Easter (Easter Week), the Solemnity of the Annunciation this year was bumped from its usual date, March 25th, all the way to tomorrow. During these Easter days, it is fitting to remember the beginning of the Word's Incarnation in the womb of Mary, and the beginning of all our lives.

Human beings are created not at birth but at their conception. The single, newly conceived cell has completely different DNA than its mother or father, and it develops completely according to its own design, replicating, growing, differentiating. The new little person may be tinier than the head of a pin, but he or she requires the same things we born persons need: Shelter, nourishment, and love. Give God thanks today for the gift of your life because you are a gift!!! Ask God how you can make your life a further gift for others.

Priests' Jubilee

This Tuesday afternoon and evening, all the priests of the Archdiocese will make their way to Fremont to concelebrate Mass with the Archbishop and anticipate the various milestone anniversaries of brother diocesan and religious priests. Among them, please note a few with special connections to our parishes. Fr. Jim Tieggs began his priesthood at St. Philip Neri Church fifty years ago. He was assigned to the parish as an assistant after his ordination. Our friend, Fr. Stephen Gutsell, who served as pastor to St. John the Baptist in Fort Calhoun and whose his life was tragically taken on last Dec. 10th, would have celebrated forty years of priesthood this year. He grew up in Blessed Sacrament Parish and attended Holy Name High School. He told me on the day before he died that he received his vocation through the faith and example of his mom, attendance at daily Mass, and through the beautiful mural in the sanctuary of Blessed Sacrament Church. He told me that he meditated upon that artwork day after day and that it profoundly influenced him and his vocational discernment.

While my actual anniversary of ordination isn't until June 5, I am celebrating twenty-five years of priesthood this year. Unworthy though I am, I am so grateful to God for calling me and for giving me the grace to accept His invitation. I cannot imagine anything more humbling or better than serving as His priest and caring for His dearest possession, His pearl of greatest price: You!!! Please pray for priests.



“Happy for they who abandon themselves to God’s guidance, confide in His goodness and remain at peace in the midst of storms.” - St. Vincent de Paul

The Lenten Season can be a time of reflection and renewal and because of springtime around the corner can also be a time for strong winds, hail and rainstorms causing havoc and upending the lives of those affected by the weather. The same is true for the people we serve here at the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

The people who seek assistance from the Society are likely facing the most difficult, challenging, and tumultuous times in their lives. As a result of a job loss or reduction in work hours, medical calamity, divorce or major setback these individuals and families are facing a financial crisis that is unique to them, with most teetering on the brink of homelessness - some have already fallen into homelessness.

Of the thousands of families and individuals we serve annually the vast majority live paycheck to paycheck. Encountering just one of the life-changing events can cause a “storm” in their lives from which they simply cannot recover. The aftermath forces them to choose which bills they can pay and those they cannot. These neighbors get so far behind financially, that utility shut-off and evictions notices are the ultimate results. In essence, the cloudburst of challenges that they face often turns into a thunderstorm, which inevitably squalls into a tempest. And as is so often the case, in their frantic search for assistance someone they know suggests they contact SVdP. This is the moment we here at St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament step in.

Our volunteers screen the calls, and we reach out with a caring ear and a steady hand to help calm the turbulent waters in which our neighbors find themselves. We provide financial resources to cover back rent or delinquent utility bills or other bills. We have a Food Pantry and clothing available at our Thrift Stores and a list of other available sources of assistance that might be of use in their situation.

In closing, I would like to announce that we have once again been offered a matching grant for 2025 - every dollar we raise between now and November 1st will be matched up to \$20,000! Monetary donations can be sent to or dropped off at the Parish Office, or in the donation boxes located in the back of Church, by the usher’s room, and by the South (breezeway) door.

Any donation amount is greatly appreciated. 100% of all donations go out to our less fortunate neighbors who find themselves in a “storm”.

We also have re-located our grocery bin for the Holy Name Food Pantry to the South (Breezeway) Door of the church. There is also one by the North Door (by the choir).


