From the Pastor

Corpus Christi

Today's celebration of Corpus Christi (The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) was instituted in medieval times to defend the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist against the heresy of Berengarius. Berengarius thought that the Eucharist was just a symbol, however, we know from both Scripture and our constant Tradition that the Eucharist truly is Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Jesus promised to be with us until the end of time and so He is in the Blessed Sacrament.

Sadly, recent statistics, surveys, and anecdotal evidence show that 70% of Catholics do not believe in the reality of Christ's Presence in the Eucharist! In response, our United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has implemented a three-year Eucharistic Revival in our country, dioceses, and individual parishes. Over the summer, both in homilies and in the bulletin, I will explain some concrete ways our parishes might rekindle devotion to God's Sacred Body and Blood and fortify our belief in the Real Presence.

Month of the Holy Hearts

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Authentic love, chastity, and mercy are found in Jesus' and in His mother's immaculate hearts. Fr. Cook & Archbishop Curtiss on June 5, 1999 In this month of June, on the Friday after the second Sunday after Pentecost,

which, this year, is this Friday, June 7th, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in a special way. Then, on Saturday, June 8th, we celebrate the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. May the radiant Heart of Christ dispel the darkness of sin and empower us to love as He loves.

Petition to Save Babies

As we enter the upcoming election season, many issues and candidates will come before us for our consideration in the voting booth. As faithful citizens and disciples of Jesus Christ, we recognize our moral responsibility to engage in the political process. Our engagement in the political process helps to protect human dignity, advance the common good, and build a society that glorifies God.

Late-pregnancy abortion is among the many issues up for consideration this November.

Abortion activists are collecting signatures to enshrine late-pregnancy abortions in the Nebraska state constitution. In other words, abortion activists want to legalize abortions of preborn babies into the second and as late as the third trimester of pregnancy.

- The ballot initiative proposal is dangerous for women and girls. It will undermine over fifty years of common-sense health and safety protections against unsafe and coercive abortion practices.
- The ballot language is deceptive. It uses purposefully vague and abstract terms to create a right to late-pregnancy abortion in the state constitution.
- The ballot language is demeaning because it creates a culture that incentivizes and expects abortion rather than builds up a "culture of life" that supports pregnant and parenting women.



Nebraskans must be educated on this ballot effort and work for its defeat. In response to this extreme ballot measure, local medical professionals are sponsoring an alternative, pro-life ballot initiative called "Protect Women & Children." Their proposal avoids creating a right to abortion and provides latepregnancy protections for preborn babies. The language also safeguards fifty years of health and safety protections that exist to protect women, girls, and babies from a dangerous abortion industry.

Catholics recognize that every human being has an inherent right to life; however, the Protect Women & Children alternative provides an "incremental step" toward greater protections for women and preborn babies in Nebraska. With these points in mind, the Bishops of Nebraska have said that Catholics can morally support the Protect Women & Children alternative ballot initiative as a defense against the dangerous, deceptive and demeaning pro-abortion ballot initiative.

Protect Women & Children must collect approximately 125,000 signatures from registered Nebraska voters for the prolife proposal to be on the ballot.

After all our Masses next weekend, June 8th and 9th, at Holy Name and St. Philip Neri Churches, parish volunteers and representatives from Protect Women & Children will be collecting signatures from anyone interested in morally supporting the pro-life ballot initiative. I appreciate your prayerful consideration and discernment of this prolife ballot effort. As we engage our family, friends, parishioners, and neighbors on this issue in the coming months, we must also redouble our efforts for women with challenging pregnancies who need our support. If pregnant women know they have our love and support, they will no longer believe abortion is their only option.

We are called by the life and example of Jesus Christ to support and make sacrifices for women and families in need. We can do this by

walking with moms in need and supporting pregnancy help organizations across the state or our diocesan social service agencies. In addition, we can advocate for laws that support mothers and families, especially low-income ones.

Finally, I want to remind you of God's mercy. There may be some among us - or those we will interact with in the coming months - who are suffering from the pain or trauma of abortion. Please know that healing and reconciliation after abortion are possible. God loves and forgives you no matter how long or recent your experience is. He wants you to forgive yourself. He wants you to experience His love, mercy and peace.

Whether you had an abortion, assisted with an abortion, or lost a son/daughter or grandchild from abortion, professional and confidential help is available through Hearts Restored Nebraska, a post-abortion healing ministry. Our parish has information for this ministry, or you can visit www.HeartsRestoredNebraska.com for details. God never grows tired of extending His love and forgiveness to us, no matter our sins or shortcomings.




