The Spirit of St. Philip Neri Award

Every year we select a parishioner or couple that embody the virtues of St. Philip Neri, especially that of joyful service, to receive the Spirit of St. Philip Neri Award. It is always a challenging assignment since our parish is replete with faith filled and loving parishioners, but this year we honor Kevin and Pamela Hughes.

Kevin has almost spent his entire life in St. Philip Neri Parish. He graduated from St. Philip Neri Catholic School in 1973 and began attending the school in first grade. He furthered his education in the neighborhood, attending a year at Rummel High School and then continuing in the school as it became Roncalli Catholic High School.

While Pam, the daughter of a military dad, traveled much in her childhood, she grew up in Papillion, attending St. Mary's Grade School and then Papillion High School. Pam and Kevin met in 1985, discovering that they both worked in the same building, and, after their wedding in 1987, they moved into the only house they have ever lived in, a house that is just up the street from St. Philip Neri Church.

It is fair to say that the church has been a beacon to them in more ways than simple geography.

Kevin's parents were highly involved in St. Philip Neri Parish. Pam also grew up in a household that greatly participated in parish life, but Kevin's parents provided a roadmap for the then newlywed couple to follow as members of St. Philip Neri Parish. Kevin and Pam sat with his parents at Mass, and, as his parents always joined parish friends for dinner after the Saturday evening Mass, Kevin and Pam continued that tradition, extending the fellowship of the Mass into solidarity with fellow parishioners. In fact, these dinners grew beyond the goodness of camaraderie; they became the occasion of small group sharing around the Gospel through the Live Lent Together series.

As both Kevin and Pam attended Catholic Schools, so they enrolled their own children, Jeff and Allison, into St. Philip Neri Catholic School. The Hughes poured themselves into service of the school, serving as treasures for the Home and School. Kevin was a coach and Pam was the troop leader to the school's Girl Scouts. Since no one wanted to keep score for basketball and volleyball games, Pam and Kevin volunteered.


As an auditor, Kevin has assisted the parish's Finance Council with his financial savvy and acumen. He has served on the council since Fr. Loecker first asked him on to it. He has further helped to count money for our Fall Festival. He also has served as the Financial Secretary of our Knights of Columbus and has volunteered to help in much of their community-building outreach, from Movie Knights to Pancake Breakfasts. From behind the counter, Kevin enjoys meeting fellow parishioners and guests. For Kevin, it is all about the community of our parish that draws him in and gives him life. It is no different with Pam.

Pam used her knowledge of Excel and offered a way to assist then parish secretary Kathy Rossitto with the scheduling of all the liturgical ministers. For around the last 15 years, Pam has continued this helpful role (though Pam is happy to pass it on to another kind parishioner should one be willing to adopt this important, specialized ministry – hint, hint, hint). Pam herself is an ardent member of Toastmasters and has used her excellent speaking and narrating skills to enhance our worship. She has served as a parish lector for approximately 5 years. She loves to prepare for the proclamation of the Word, diving into the readings a week in advance. She pours over the workbooks to understand the material and so that she can help the congregation hear God's voice for them.

Such preparation also enhances Pam's own communion with the Lord. She credits Fr. Loecker for opening the power of the Word to her during the Year of St. Paul, when he offered classes in between the morning Masses about Scripture. It dawned upon her that human beings don't change. The Bible is relevant to all of us and not just to people thousands of years ago. They relate to us now! More recently, seeing a need to recruit more EMHC, Pam has volunteered to train them, even when she isn't one. Pam and Kevin don't wait to be called upon, but offer solutions and assistance wherever they can, even stepping into the unknown.

Though already Catholic herself, Pam regularly attended our parish's classes for adults becoming Catholic. She loves to grow in her faith and knowledge and has also attended various Bible Studies offered by parishioners Marsha Moon and Diane Sullivan. This year we began a new way of offering formation for adults wishing to become Catholic. Rather than a standard, one-size-fits-all, weekly, fixed meeting, our parish has begun to offer various small groups and mentors to lead individuals or families into the Faith. This new approach allows inquirers to start formation whenever they come to us and in a way that accommodates those with unique work and family schedules, as well as backgrounds and needs. I asked Pam to consider becoming the mentor of one of these small groups. At first, she was concerned: What if the candidates had questions she didn't know? How would she present the materials? Any fear or apprehension didn't keep Pam from saying yes, and she leaned into the adventure, noting that "nothing is ever as hard as it seems." As a result of her yes, a mother and son both received Baptism and the further Sacraments of Initiation in the Easter Vigil.

Kevin and Pam are opposites in many ways. He is more extroverted while she is more introverted, but both share a deep love of this parish and the community that nourishes them. Though there have been lots of changes in the parish over the years, from various pastors to parish mergers and changed Mass times and locations, Kevin and Pam see one consistent truth: the community of believers. Both are grateful for the continuity, familiarity, and bonds of love present in our parish, a truth symbolized by the very proximity of their home to the church building and school. As much as they have received from the parish, they wish to give back. Reminiscing and in a spirit of thanksgiving and determination, Kevin remarks: "I don't want to lose this." In acknowledgement of their humble service and dogged dedication to sustain our parish, we are honored to present the 2024 Spirit of St. Philip Neri Award to Kevin and Pam Hughes. They will be officially honored during today's 10 a.m. Mass, Sunday, May 26th, the very memorial of St. Philip Neri.




