Kids Say the Darndest Things!

It only seems right today to celebrate the fruit of motherhood: Children. Recently, I have had a smattering of encounters with kids at our two parishes who have shown deep devotion, creativity, and virtuous faith. I hope these encounters and messages inspire you as they did me.

Little Sparrows

While attending the outdoor celebration of Deacon Rafael's 1st anniversary of ordination last Sunday, a few kids who attend Holy Name School and Holy Name Church came over to fetch me. They had found a dead baby bird on the sidewalk and wanted me to come and see it. Upon arriving at the tiny carcass, the kids expressed their sadness and asked if we could say a prayer for it, which we did. They had such tender hearts, and, after a while, I returned to the party (and to some delicious carne asada).

About ten minutes later, the same children returned and wanted me to see something. In my absence, the kids had assembled various twigs to create a square around the fallen baby bird, a "cemetery", and adorned

it with three twig crosses, as well as various dandelions, green grass, and assorted, found flowers. They wanted to do something to show that this little bird mattered, especially if the mother bird came looking for her missing chick. Their sincere attentiveness and imagination reminded me of Jesus's words and the Father's affection for you and me: "'Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows'," (Mt 10:29-31).

The Deep Faith of Children

The following prayers and comments come from various second grade students at St. Philip Neri Catholic School. Yes, you read that right: these are the words and testimony of little second graders!

- "God, it was a suffering that Judas betrayed you. How you suffered on the cross when you looked so beautiful. Most of this was because of me, your son."
- "God, please let me be the rock like Peter."
- "O my Lord, My Savior. You died for me, and I will live for you, My Lord. Amen."
- "Jesus, on the night of the Last Supper when you celebrated Passover, Judas betrayed you. We will not betray you."

 story to Mrs. Merriman, our SPN Catholic School 2nd Grade Teacher: The student was explaining the scapular to
 his family and his dad kind of chuckled when the student said he had to wear it all the time. The student turned
 to his dad and said, "You won't be laughing when I'm buried with it."

Pentecost Vigil

Next weekend, May 18-19, we celebrate the conclusion of the Easter Season and commemorate the gift of the Holy Spirit: Pentecost! One of the ancient customs for Pentecost is the extended Pentecost Vigil. Much like the Easter Vigil that began the Easter Season, the Vigil of Pentecost contains additional readings and psalms from Sacred Scripture. Unlike the early Church we won't stay up all night in anticipation and celebration but please be aware that the 5 p.m. Pentecost Vigil Mass in English at Holy Name next Saturday, May 18th, will be slightly longer and more lavish than usual. Come Holy Spirit, come!


Totus Tuus 2024






