Archbishop Lucas Turns 75!

Archbishop Lucas turns 75 years of age on this Wed, June 12th! Please pray for him and consider sending him a card or a kind email or voicemail at the Chancery to encourage him. At 75, he also officially sends in his letter to the Pope to be considered for retirement. I doubt the Pope will accept and act upon this letter for a few years – Archbishop Lucas is in good health and continues to perform a remarkable job as a spiritual pastor, leading us, making difficult decisions, and keeping us focused on the urgent need to share our faith and serve others.

His Excellency's birthday also reminds us that anytime in the next couple of years we will receive a new archbishop. Please pray for whomever that man will be, and please pray in gratitude for the service Archbishop George J. Lucas has provided northeast Nebraska these many years. I can only speak from my own experience, but His Excellency has been a loving father to us priests, a wise, savvy, and merciful judge, and a fervent example of prayer and holiness. None of us know how heavy is the office of the episcopacy and the crosses that come with it. Pray for him,

The Altar Rail: Prelude

We are so blessed to have beautiful churches. Unlike many churches that were redesigned and, in those changes, lost much of their splendor, Holy Name and St. Philip Neri churches still shine! One example of their retained elegance is their altar rails, sometimes called a Communion rail or balustrade. There is a common misconception that Vatican II ordered the dismantling of altar rails. It did not. In fact, there is no document from Vatican II or thereafter that calls for the disuse of a Communion rail. In this time of decreased faith in the Real Presence in the Eucharist and our bishops' call to a Eucharistic Revival in the United States, I believe that a restoration of receiving Holy Communion at the altar rail will foster greater belief in and reverence for the Blessed Sacrament.

Now before you get worried, let me assure you that you will still be able to receive Communion standing or kneeling, on the tongue or on the palm of your hand: That is your choice. We are simply shifting the location where people receive Communion. Rather than receive on the move, you will be standing or kneeling along the altar rail and wait for the priest, deacon, or EMHC to bring you Communion. This will allow you more time to meditate and to prepare yourself for Communion. It is more dignified and, if anything, reduces the total time for Communion.

I am working with businesses to make a nice, comfortable kneeling pad for the altar rail at SPN Church, and there is already a similar kneeling pads along the HN altar rail. This pad will facilitate kneeling should people choose to kneel. We will begin receiving Communion at the altar rail on the weekend of July 21 & 22 to be in solidarity with the National Eucharistic Congress occurring in Indianapolis at the same time – it's the first National Eucharistic Congress in 83 years! However, I ask an enormous favor: an open heart.

Before our implementation date, allow me to explain the logic of this decision through various, weekly articles in the bulletin henceforth. I hope to dispel any misconceptions about the rail and explain the great spiritual and practical benefits of using it. Please speak with Jesus in the Eucharist about this change, your hopes or worries, and read my future bulletin articles. Try receiving Communion at the rail with an open mind and heart. What could it hurt? What could be gained?

Resetting Parish Sick Lists

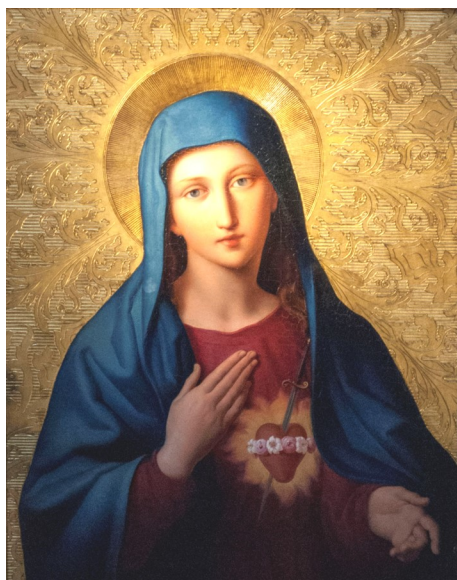

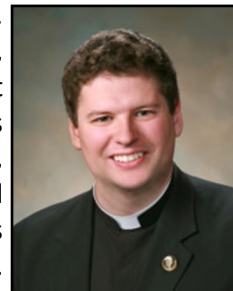

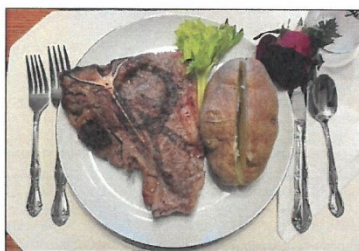
