God speaks to us in many ways, including through this Sunday's Scripture readings.

Reading 1: Jeremiah 23:1-6 Psalm 23:1-6 Reading 2: Ephesians 2:13-18 Gospel Mark 6:30-34

"The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught. He said to them, 'Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.' People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat. So they went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place. People saw them leaving and many came to know about it. They hastened there on foot from all the towns and arrived at the place before them. When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things." (Mark :30-34).

Questions of the Week: "Come away ... and rest a while." Why is rest important? How do I keep Sunday as a day of rest? "They hastened there on foot..." Do I hasten to the Lord or rush past Him? What keeps me from seeking the Lord and spending more time with Him?

Jesus' heart was moved with pity for the people who were gathered. Who are the people I am moved with pity for? Who is in need of my compassion? What can I do to help them?

The Pope's worldwide prayer intention for the month of July is for the pastoral care of the sick. We pray that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick confer to those who receive it and their loved ones the power of the Lord and become ever more a visible sign of compassion and hope for all.

From the Pastor

The Preciousness of Life

Our nation is still reeling from the shocking assassination attempt of Donald J. Trump last weekend. Few things this frightening have been witnessed by thousands of people in real time as they blithely watched their televisions and screens. Not since 9/11 has such unexpected horror been broadcast to so many and so vividly. Moreover, it reminds us of other leaders who were assassinated or who survived their attacks, courageous individuals such as President John F. Kennedy and U.S. Senator Robert F. Kennedy; Martin Luther King, Jr.; President Ronald Reagan; and Pope St. John Paul II. God bless all those who have been permanently silenced or attacked simply for their beliefs and convictions.

As Christians, we especially offer our prayers for the eternal repose of those killed, both the twenty-year-old assassin and his innocent victim, a husband and father, and we pray for the swift and complete recovery of those wounded in the attack, especially former President Trump. We pray for the protection of President Biden, for all elected officials, and for all candidates running for office. The attack last weekend is a grim reminder of the preciousness of life and of every moment. None of us know the day or the hour when tragedy may befall us or our loved ones. Have we told them that we love them? Have we reconciled with estranged relatives and friends? Are we truly ready to meet our Maker and receive His judgment?

Assassinations may be particularly and thankfully rare, but the frailty of human life is ever before us. May we as Christians help heal our nation through active love of neighbor, acceptance of suffering, true forgiveness of and good will towards enemies, and the commitment to defend the life of every human being.



Instructions for the Altar Rail

Today, thousands of Catholics have converged in Indianapolis, IN to attend the National Eucharistic Congress. We have parishioners and parish families there right now! Though we cannot join the event physically, we can do so spiritually as we resume the traditional practice of distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail, both in Holy Name and St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament parishes. We hope the change in practice will elicit deeper faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, in Him Who invites us personally to come forward and to recline or stand at the extension of His Last Supper table and altar.

Because this custom is new to most, please study the diagram and directions here and below. There will, no doubt, be some initial uncertainty and awkwardness at first, but, over time, it will become a habit. The pads for the altar rail step that will make kneeling easier are, sadly, not finished yet – local Denny & Son Upholstery Inc. is custom making them, and they should be here in a couple of weeks or sooner.

- When the priest celebrant gives himself the Body of Christ, two ushers will come forward to stand in front of the first pews and instruct those in the first pews to exit their seats and come to the center aisle where they will come forward in the familiar two lines.
- 2. Those seated in the transepts or outer quadrants of pews should walk through the corresponding pews to join the lines in the center aisle.
- 3. The ushers and taped lines on the floor will help communicants to line up along the altar rail, starting from the center of the rail and moving outwards on each side. Communicants should fill the rail, leaving no gaps between them.
- 4. Communicants may either stand or kneel at the rail and receive Communion either on the hands or on the tongue.
- After a communicant receives the Body of Christ and departs from the rail, the next person waiting in line immediately fills the vacated spot.
- Those wishing to receive the Precious Blood of Christ may continue to the Deacon or EMHC holding a chalice; all others may return to their seats by way of the customary side aisles.
- 7. After the distribution of Holy Communion at the altar rail concludes, those who are immobile will receive Communion in their pews. They should wave their arm to attract the attention of a minister, unless they have already made their need known another way.

Tuesday, July 30: Live Safe Environment Training for Parish and School Volunteers and Employees

The Archdiocese of Omaha requires that all adults who interact with children and youth and vulnerable adults in the name of the Church become Safe Environment Certified. Training will be held at Saint Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament Parish on Tuesday, July 30th from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in our Parish Center, which is underneath the Church. Please enter through the red door on the West side of the Church next to the breezeway or the red door to the right of the Church Entrance on 30th Street. Make your way downstairs. An elevator is available near the 30th Street entrance for those who need it.

You must pre-register online at this Catholic Mutual link: https://omaha.CMGconnect.org. Other training dates and locations are available throughout the city. For help with registration, please contact Mary in the Parish Office.


