God speaks to us in many ways, including through this Sunday's Scripture readings.

Reading 1: 2 Kings 4:42-44 Psalm 145:10-18 Reading 2: Ephesians 4:1-6 Gospel John 6:1-15

The miracle performed by Elisha finds its perfect fulfillment in Jesus' feeding of the five thousand. The miraculous feeding in today's Gospel provides a glimpse of the heavenly banquet, where there will never be hunger again. The multiplication of the loaves symbolizes Jesus' feeding of his disciples in the Eucharist through the ages.

Questions of the Week:

"[Jesus] said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do," (John 6:6).

When have I felt that my faith is being tested? How do I respond to these tests?

"Let all your works give you thanks, O Lord, and let your faithful ones bless you. Let them discourse of the glory of your kingdom and speak of your might. The eyes of all look hopefully to you, and you give them their food in due season; you open your hand and satisfy the desire of every living thing," (Psalm 145:10-11, 15).

"There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish... Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining," (John 6:9, 11).

For what do I need to give thanks? How do my feelings of gratitude affect my practice of charity?

The Pope's worldwide prayer intention for the month of July is for the pastoral care of the sick. We pray that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick confer to those who receive it and their loved ones the power of the Lord and become ever more a visible sign of compassion and hope for all.

Religious Education Classes

Training will be held at Saint Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament Parish on Tuesday, July 30th from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in our Parish Center, which is underneath the Church. Please enter through the red door on the West side of the Church next to the breezeway or the red door to the right of the Church Entrance on 30th Street. Make your way downstairs. An elevator is available near the 30th Street entrance for those who need it.

At the Altar Rail:**Embracing Humility in Communion**

In sanctuaries old, where reverence thrived,
A rail divides the holy from the meek,
In humble kneel, we seek the grace derived,
From Christ's own hand, His love is at its peak.

For whosoever little is, come near,
With childlike heart, we journey to His feast,
In faith we draw, devoid of worldly fear,
To meet our Lord, we kneel in sacred peace.

The rail, a symbol rich of love and grace,
Where Heaven meets the Earth in sacred space,
We come, in sorrow for our sins, to place
Our hearts, our offerings in Christ's embrace.

At altar rail, in reverent kneel we pray,
Our hearts in humble offerings we bind,
In Christ's own body, bread of life this day,
A gift divine, in Eucharist we find.

This holy rite, a sacrifice so pure,
In Mass, our Savior's presence we adore,
In bloodless form, His love and grace ensure,
That we are blessed and shall be evermore.

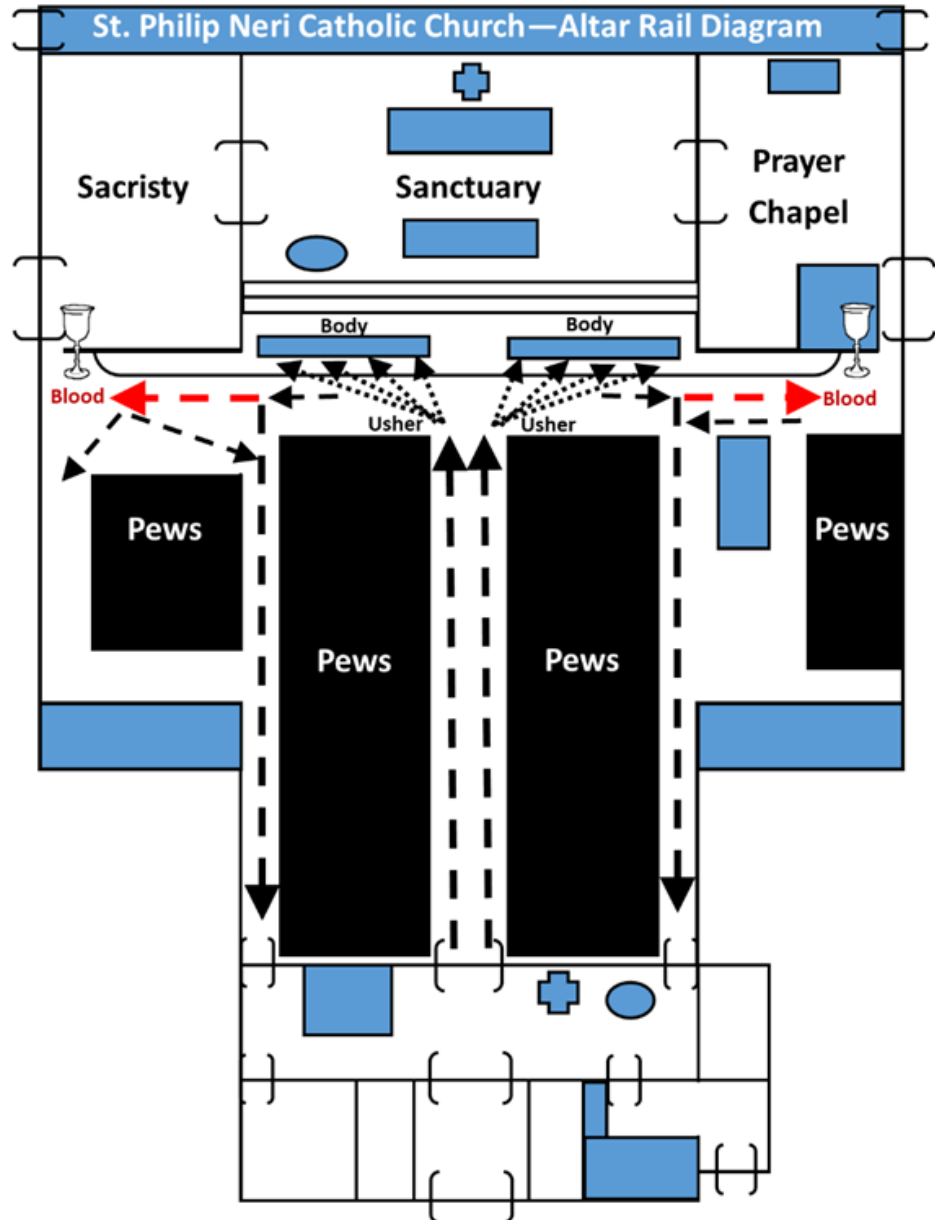
For in this act, our humble hearts we raise,
To join with Christ in sacrifice and love,
In kneeling, we receive His boundless grace,
A touch of Heaven from the Lord above.

So let us come, with hearts both pure and true,
To altar rail, where love and grace abound,
In humble kneel, our souls we shall renew,
In Christ's embrace, our peace and joy are found.

Instructions for the Altar Rail

To take part in the National Eucharistic Revival and to restore and increase faith in the Blessed Sacrament, our parishes have resumed the traditional practice of distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail. We hope the change in practice will elicit deeper faith and relationship with Jesus, Who invites us personally to come forward and to recline or stand at this extension of His Last Supper table and altar, to commune with Him sacramentally or to receive a prayer of spiritual communion.

1. When the priest celebrant gives himself the Body of Christ, two ushers will come forward to stand in front of the first pews to assist the congregation. At this time, the sacred musicians and singers should also make their way to the altar rail, lining up first closest to the center of the church and going outwards.
2. Immediately after the priest leads and says the Communion Antiphon, the congregation should begin to exit their seats, beginning with the first pews, and come forward down the center aisle in the familiar two lines.
3. Those seated in the transepts or outer quadrants of pews should walk through the corresponding pews to join the lines in the center aisle.
4. The ushers and taped lines on the floor will help communicants to line up along the altar rail, starting from the center of the church and moving outwards to the ends of the rail. **Communicants should fill the rail shoulder to shoulder, leaving no gaps between them.**
5. Communicants may either stand or kneel at the rail and receive Communion either on the hands or on the tongue.
6. After a communicant receives the Body of Christ and departs from the rail, the next person waiting in line immediately fills the vacated spot.
7. Those wishing to receive the Precious Blood of Christ may continue to the Deacon or EMHC holding a chalice at the far ends of the altar rail; all others may return to their seats by way of the customary side aisles.

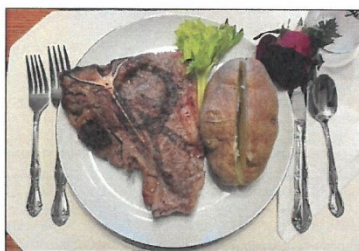
