From the Pastor

The Queenship of Mary

This Thursday and on every August 22nd, we commemorate the octave day or the eighth day after the Solemnity of the Assumption: We celebrate the Queenship of Mary! St. Pius XII instituted this specific memorial on Oct. 11, 1954, but, from the earliest centuries of our Catholic Faith, Christians have regarded Our Lady as spiritual royalty. She is featured in the Book of Revelation as the woman clothed with the sun, standing atop the moon, and having "on her head a crown of twelve stars," (Rev. 12:1). Both the Assumption and the Coronation of Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth, are longtime fixtures of the Glorious Mysteries of our rosary. Christians have intuited and believed in Mary's queenship because of their belief in Jesus: After all, if Jesus Christ is King of the Universe and Prince of Peace, His mother must be a queen, right?

Mary is not God. She is a human being like us, but she possesses such a preeminent status because she is the Mother of God, because her yes allowed the Son to become incarnate, because she was conceived without sin and remained ever faithful and sinless. She is the most noble of all of God's creatures and of the human race. Where she has gone, we and the whole Church hope to follow.

When we were baptized, we were baptized "priests, prophets and kings." That spiritual kingship will come to its fruition for us in Heaven, where we, adopted children of God, will be so united with Him as to become "partakers of His Divine nature" (2 Pet. 1:4).

By His generous grace, we, too, will one day reign with the Savior, princes and princesses, kings and queens, in His Celestial Kingdom.

Minister Mandation

Any Lectors or EMHCs in HN or SPN-BS parishes that have gone through liturgical training online with the Archdiocese and completed our local training at either of our two parishes but who have not been formally mandated yet are invited to attend our 5 p.m. Mass in Holy Name on Saturday, August 31st. Towards the end of the Mass, such ministers will be asked to come forward and to participate in the mandation ceremony, which will be conducted in both English and in Spanish.

Parish Offices Closed Aug. 23rd

Both the Holy Name and St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament parish offices will be closed this Friday, August 23rd, so that the respective staffs can attend an all day, archdiocesan workshop on evangelization. The Archbishop's Big Goal is still effective. His Excellency desires that all parishes become missional communities, i.e., outwards looking communities that actively invite and help people to enter into a deeper relationship with Jesus, with our Catholic Church, and in our parish life.

Parent Meeting for All Children Receiving Sacraments

Is your child hoping to receive the sacrament of Confirmation and/or First Communion during this 2024-2025 academic year? A parent or parents (or a deputed adult, e.g., grandparent, aunt/uncle, sponsor, etc.) of such children and youth, whether they are enrolled in Holy Name or St. Philip Neri schools, our parishes' Religious Education Program, or homeschool, **MUST attend the informational meeting to register their children and to learn about the expectations and dates for reception of said sacraments in the 2024-2025 school year.** The meeting will occur on Wednesday, August 28th from 6:15 p.m.-7:30 p.m. in St. Philip Neri Catholic School building (8202 N. 31st St., Omaha, NE 68112). Religious Education Program Registration

We are now accepting registrations for our 2024-2025 Religious Education Program until the end of August. Classes will be held on Wednesdays from 6:15 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. in the Saint Philip Neri Catholic School, located at 8202 N 31st St, Omaha NE. Register at the Holy Name Parish Office, located at 3014 N 45th Street, on Wednesdays and Thursdays of August from 9 am to 6 pm. Religious Education Program Requirements

- This is a faith enrichment program for any children, entering 1st grade through 9th grade.
- It also offers two-year preparation programs for desiring any sacrament and who are not enrolled in a Catholic school or homeschool.
- The tuition fee is \$50 per child, with a max fee of \$150 per 3 children or more, paid at the time of registration.
- Copies of both birth and baptismal certificates are <u>required for registration</u>.
- Children must be at least 7 years old for their first year of First Communion preparation and at least 12 years old for the first year of Confirmation preparation.
- Those entering a second year of sacramental preparation are <u>still required</u> to register.
- R.E. classes begin on September 11th (A mandatory orientation meeting for parents with children in R.E. is on September 4th).
- All R.E. parent meetings and R.E. classes will take place in St. Philip Neri Catholic School (8202 N. 31st St., Omaha, NE 68112) on Wednesdays from 6:15 p.m.-7:30 p.m.

Becoming Catholic in English

Becoming Catholic (RCIA or OCIA) is our process conducted in English for anyone 8 years and older desiring to receive Baptism. It is also our process for any Catholic adults who are still in need of receiving Confirmation, Reconciliation, or First Communion. Four years ago, the archdiocese rolled out the Vision and Priorities. One Church: Encountering Jesus, Equipping Disciples, and Living Mercy. To help fulfill the purpose of the Church and to live out their vocation as missional communities, parishes are expected to develop a clear path of discipleship. What does that mean? A clear path to discipleship is a parish framework designed to help both new and experienced parishioners take the next step in their formation as missionary disciples of Jesus. In other words, a parish framework to make and mature disciples. Overseen by parish leadership, the pastor guides and oversees the integrated development of clear path while the evangelization coordinator is responsible for leading its implementation.

A clear path makes it easier for a parish to...

- See the baptized grow and reach their full stature in Christ
- Bring back the lost sheep who have wandered away
- Send missionary disciples who are fully equipped to share their faith
- Become an outpost of mercy and healing for the neighborhood

Members of the archdiocesan parish support team will be presenting an introduction to the Clear Path, guiding us through an assessment, and helping us discern our path forward with the Pastoral Council in the coming months, however, in its ongoing support, the archdiocese is presenting an Evangelization Team Orientation on August $23^{\rm rd}$, which will give us a chance as a team to have a better understanding of the tools we need to accomplish this.

This Workshop is built to:

- Orient evangelization teams to the Archdiocesan Vision and Big Goal.
- Connect them to peers and to coaches who can support them.
- Give these teams tools for building a Clear Path that can be replicated with their parishioners.

Our offices will be closed on Friday, August 23rd, so that members of our staff, pastoral council, school administration, and others from our evangelization team can attend the Evangelization Orientation as a team working together to better form ourselves to be at the service of the church. I hope this doesn't cause any inconvenience; however, I believe this will help our team better prepare to foster conversion within our parish family.

Please pray for us as we begin to articulate and set out a path for discipleship. Ask Jesus what his plan is. Invite the Holy Spirit into your prayer and imagine with him what could be possible for your parish community if we were truly a *missional community*.



A widowed grandmother, whose daughter and 3 -month-old granddaughter have moved in to escape an abusive situation, with no electricity in her house (OPPD disconnected due to unpaid bills); a divorced mom who left her job temporarily to care for her disabled son along with his brother and baby sister, and now is in danger of losing OPPD and MUD; and a single man who is barely getting by cannot get to work unless he can either pay for car repairs or pay the utility bill to keep the power on. What do they all have in common? They have all called our SVDP help line this past month asking for assistance, along with at least 40 other calls. They usually have reached out to other charitable organizations, but the response we get most often is "you are the only one who has called me back".

We have assisted these families and many others this past year, and with the help of our Parish Family, we will continue to be a beacon of hope to the less fortunate in our community. We have a matching grant of \$20,000 that will help fund our mission for 2025 and we need \$3,500 to reach our goal by October 31st. We also have collection bins for the Holy Name Food Pantry located at all church entrances - cereals, spaghetti sauce/pasta, snack foods - are all greatly appreciated. We also will be holding a coat drive on the last 2 weekends of September to support the SVDP Annual Winter Coat Giveaway which will be held on October 19 at the Omaha Home for Boys. Blue Barrels will be placed in the Church and School to collect gently used coats, jackets, hats, and gloves for distribution to those in need.
