Questions of the Week:


You are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Why do I look for Jesus? What do I hope to receive from Him?

From the Pastor

Saint Alphonsus Liguori

Last Thursday, August 1st, was the memorial of St. Alphonsus Liguori, the patron Saint to Holy Name Parish and the founder of the Redemptorist Order. There is also a deep connection between the Redemptorist Order and the beloved icon of Mother of Perpetual Help. For this reason, all churches touched by the ministry of Redemptorist priests and brothers display the icon and foster devotions and novenas through her intercession.

The memorial of Mary, the Mother of Perpetual Help is held on June 27th every year. Unlike conventional western art that has historically sought to portray an idea, event, landscape, or person, icons are more mysterious. Icons are not painted but written. The Logos, the Word of God, speaks through them. Icons are not a picture of heaven but a window onto it. When one prays before an icon, one doesn't just remember its subject matter; one encounters the subject him- or herself, one experiences the divine reality. By grace, the icon makes the reality present and so approximates a sacrament. For this reason, candles burn before icons like the sanctuary lamp does before the tabernacle. There are icons of the Mother of Perpetual Help in both of our Holy Name and St. Philip Neri churches and schools.

No one knows entirely when this icon was written. Research confirms that it is in a style existent as early as 1,000 A.D., and

it may be based on even earlier, similar images written by Lazarus the Monk in the early 600s. Whatever the case, tradition holds that it was brought from Crete in the 14th century, stolen by a merchant of Venice (I know what you're thinking and no, that's a different story) and brought by him to Rome in 1495 and displayed in a private home. Four years later, the Blessed Mother appeared to a young child in that same home and revealed her name, the name that would be associated with the icon: Perpetual Help. Our Lady asked for her image to reside in the Irish Augustinian Church of St. Matthew in Rome. There it remained for three centuries.

In 1798, St. Matthew Church was destroyed by Napoleonic forces. Fast forward, and In January of 1854-1855, the Redemptorist Order unknowingly secured the land where St. Matthew Church once stood. There, they built their headquarters and the Church of St. Alphonsus, named after the order's founder, St. Alphonsus Liguori. Learning that this was the very spot in which our Lady asked for her holy icon of Mother of Perpetual Help to be shown three centuries earlier, Fr. Nicholas Mauron, the Redemptorist Superior General, asked Pope St. Pius IX to transfer the care of the icon to the Redemptorists, which His Holiness granted. On April 26, 1866, the icon was enthroned in St. Alphonsus Church in Rome, and Pope St. Pius IX charged the Redemptorists to "preach Perpetual Help to the whole world."

The original icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, or Mother of Perpetual Help or Our Lady of Perpetual Succor, is featured in this church to this day. While the image is small in stature, only about 16x20" in size, it remains essential to Catholic devotion throughout the world. To gaze on the image and pray before it is to be mystically transported to the Virgin herself, to be held in those same arms that caress her Son, Jesus Christ. All are invited into those same arms every Tuesday and Wednesday, when, after the respective morning Masses in St. Philip Neri and Holy Name churches, we offer devotional prayers to Our Mother of Perpetual Help.

Explanation of the Icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help

Text taken from a plaque in the National Shrine Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes in Emmitsburg, MD.

He, who first brought to the Most Pure Lady the News of Joy, now shows beforehand the signs of the Passion; but Christ, clothed in mortal flesh and fearing death, is frightened at the vision. This then is the story of the picture of our Mother of Perpetual Help.

The Archangels come from Heaven carrying the Cross and nails, the spear and the lance. Christ, Who has taken upon Himself our entire human nature with all our emotions and weaknesses, is frightened at seeing such a vision. Trembling, He becomes afraid and seeks refuge in the arms of His Mother. Christ, however, did not suffer alone. Always at His side as the Companion of His sorrow is His Mother. Mary as well as Christ suffered in advance the bitterness of the Passion. Shortly after Christ's birth, the aged Prophet Simeon, while holding the Infant Savior in his arms, promised Mary a life filled with suffering. "Thy own soul a sword shall pierce,' he prophesied."

Religious Education Program Requirements

- This is a faith enrichment program for any children, entering 1st grade through 9th grade.
- It also offers two-year preparation programs for desiring any sacrament and who are not enrolled in a Catholic school or homeschool.
- The tuition fee is \$50 per child, with a max fee of \$150 per 3 children or more, paid at the time of registration.
- Copies of both birth and baptismal certificates are <u>required for registration</u>.
- Children must be at least 7 years old for their first year of First Communion preparation and at least 12 years old for the first year of Confirmation preparation.
- Those entering a second year of sacramental preparation are still required to register.
- R.E. classes begin on September 11th (A mandatory orientation meeting for parents with children in R.E. is on September 4th).
- All R.E. parent meetings and R.E. classes will take place in St. Philip Neri Catholic School (8202 N. 31st St., Omaha, NE 68112) on Wednesdays from 6:15 p.m.-7:30 p.m.

Becoming Catholic in English

Becoming Catholic (RCIA or OCIA) is our process conducted in English for anyone 8 years and older desiring to receive Baptism. It is also our process for any Catholic adults who are still in need of receiving Confirmation, Reconciliation, or First Communion. 
