God speaks to us in many ways, including through this Sunday's Scripture readings.

Reading 1: Isaiah 35: 4-7a Psalm 146:6-10 Reading 2: James 2:1-5 Gospel Mark 7:31-37

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!"- that is, "Be opened!" - And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly. He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak." (Mk 7:32-37)

What word or words in this passage caught your attention? What in this passage comforted you? What in this passage challenged you? What conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me? He took him off by himself away from the crowd.

Where do I go to be alone and pray? How can I make space in my schedule for "alone time" with God? Then he looked up to heaven and groaned.

What concerns trouble my heart? How can I bring these concerns to God in prayer? But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it.

While we officially celebrate the 23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time today in accord with liturgical law, September 8th is also known as the birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Let us pray the rosary or a portion of the rosary today in love of Mary.

Happy Grandparents' Day!


National Grandparents Day today is an observance and not a public holiday in the United States. The day's origins are not known with certainty, but many attribute the efforts of Marian Lucille Herndon McQuade, a housewife in West Virginia, to have been a primary catalyst for the celebration. Throughout the '70s McQuade worked hard to educate the people about the important contributions senior citizens make. She also urged people to adopt a grandparent, not for one day a year and not for material giving, but for a lifetime of experience.

What is known with certainty is that a presidential proclamation on September 6, 1979, made this day official – it designated Sunday, September 9, 1979, (being the "first Sunday of September following Labor Day") as National Grandparents Day. Each year the President is requested to issue a proclamation to designate the first Sunday in September after Labor Day as National Grandparents Day; and to call on people, groups and organizations to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies and activities. May Ss. Joachim and Ann, the grandparents to Jesus, intercede for all our grandparents, living and deceased.

Religious Education Program

Formal registration has closed for our 2024-2025 Religious Education Program, but interested families can still inquire about registration by contacting Monica Valles, our bilingual Director of Religious Education (D.R.E.), at 402-451-6622 x804 or mavalles@archomaha.org.

Religious Education Program Requirements

- This is a faith enrichment program for any children, entering 1st grade through 9th grade.
- It also offers two-year preparation programs for desiring any sacrament and who are not enrolled in a Catholic school or homeschool.
- The tuition fee is \$50 per child, with a max fee of \$150 per 3 children or more, paid at the time of registration.
- Copies of both birth and baptismal certificates are required for registration.
- Children must be at least 7 years old for their first year of First Communion preparation and at least 12 years old for the first year of Confirmation preparation.
- Those entering a second year of sacramental preparation are <u>still required</u> to register.
- R.E. classes for children begin on September 11th (A mandatory orientation meeting just for parents with children in R.E. is on September 4th).
- All R.E. parent meetings and R.E. classes will take place in St. Philip Neri Catholic School (8202 N. 31st St., Omaha, NE 68112) on Wednesdays from 6:15 p.m.-7:30 p.m.

Becoming Catholic in English

Becoming Catholic (RCIA or OCIA) is our process conducted in English for anyone 8 years and older desiring to receive Baptism. It is also our process for any Catholic adults who are still in need of receiving Confirmation, Reconciliation, or First Communion. Baptism Classes in English





A widowed grandmother, whose daughter and 3-month-old granddaughter have moved in to escape an abusive situation, with no electricity in her house (OPPD disconnected due to unpaid bills); a divorced mom who left her job temporarily to care for her disabled son along with his brother and baby sister, and now is in danger of losing OPPD and MUD; and a single man who is barely getting by cannot get to work unless he can either pay for car repairs or pay the utility bill to keep the power on. What do they all have in common? They have all called our SVDP help line this past month asking for assistance, along with at least 40 other calls. They usually have reached out to other charitable organizations, but the response we get most often is "you are the only one who has called me back".

We have assisted these families and many others this past year, and with the help of our Parish Family, we will continue to be a beacon of hope to the less fortunate in our community. We have a matching grant of \$20,000 that will help fund our mission for 2025 and we need \$3,500 to reach our goal by October 31st. We also have collection bins for the Holy Name Food Pantry located at all church entrances cereals, spaghetti sauce/pasta, snack foods - are all greatly appreciated. We also will be holding a coat drive on the last 2 weekends of September to support the SVDP Annual Winter Coat Giveaway which will be held on October 19 at the Omaha Home for Boys. Blue Barrels will be placed in the Church and School to collect gently used coats, jackets, hats, and gloves for distribution to those in need.
