

God speaks to us in many ways, including through this Sunday's Scripture readings.

Reading 1: Jeremiah 31:7-9 Psalm: 126 Reading 2: Hebrews 5:1-6 Gospel: Mark 10:46-52

As Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way. (Mark 10:46-52)

Meditation (*Meditatio*): What word or words in this passage caught your attention? What in this passage comforted you? What in this passage challenged you?

Prayer (Oratio): Read the Scripture passage one more time.

Bring to the Lord the praise, petition, or thanksgiving that the Word inspires in you.

Contemplation (Contemplatio): Read the Scripture again, followed by this reflection: What conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me?

But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." When have I struggled to persevere in my faith? When have I needed the Lord's compassion?

Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you. How have I experienced God's call? How have I responded to that call?

Go your way; your faith has saved you. Where is the Lord calling me to go? How will my faith support me on the way?

Living the Word this Week: How can I make my life a gift for others in charity? If possible, plan a pilgrimage to a religious site near you physically or in spirit, and pray for those discerning their vocation.

Mandatory 1st Reconciliation Meeting

All school and parish children making their First Reconciliation in Holy Name or St. Philip Neri churches this winter must attend, along with at least one of their parents, a mandatory session in either English or in Spanish. **The session in Spanish is THIS WEDNESDAY, Oct. 30**th, from 6:15 p.m.-7:30 p.m. in the St. Philip Neri Catholic School Activity Center. Again, both the first penitent child and at least one parent (or an adult appointed by the parents) must attend the session together.

Becoming Catholic in English

- To help as a coach?



Daylight Savings Ends







To gain a plenary indulgence, the faithful must be in the state of grace, have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, receive the Sacrament of Penance, receive Holy Communion, and pray for the Holy Father (such as an Our Father and a Hail Mary). If some of the conditions are not fulfilled, the indulgence is partial.

Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.


