God speaks to us in many ways, including through this Sunday's Scripture readings.

Reading 1: | Kings 17:10-16 Psalm 146:7-10 Reading 2: Hebrews 9:24-28 Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Holy Gospel: St. Mark 12:38-44

In the course of his teaching Jesus said to the crowds, "Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets. They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers. They will receive a very severe condemnation."

He sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents. Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

Questions for the week:

How often am I more concerned about the externals of my faith instead of growing closer to God in my heart? How can I practice my faith with greater humility and selflessness?

In what ways has my prayer life become stale and dry? How can I learn to pray with greater fullness of heart?

How often do I judge people because of their economic status? How can I reach out to those who are in need in a way that recognizes their dignity?

From the Pastor

The Election is Over, so Now What?

As our country moves forward after the elections (and experiences a thankful reprieve from myriads of political ads, emails, and texts), we must remember that God is in charge. Whether you are delighted or angered by the candidates and initiatives that won or lost, the world is passing away. It is a hard truth to accept, but we Christians must embrace this reality: We are trading this world for the next. Our hope is in Heaven and from it we await a Savior.

While our salvation demands we bring justice, truth, and charity to this world as best we can, our Messiah is not a political party or an individual person, save Christ Himself. So let peace reign in your hearts. Don't let celebrations or fear, overconfidence or defeat, divert you from the Origin of all good things. Protect His peace in your heart, and please pray for our nation and for a spirit of unity, patience, understanding, freedom, cooperation, and hope. God works through every situation, whether it is in accord with our wishes or not, for "we know that all things work for good for those who love God," (Rom. 8:28). Trust and surrender to God. He will never let us down.

I must thank God for His intervention in our state and for so many loving people who prayed, offered penances, and voted against Initiative 439. Not only did the radically pro-abortion Initiative 439 fail on its own, but its competing initiative, Initiative 434, received more affirmative votes than the votes for 439. Effectively, Initiative 439 lost twice in this election, which means the right to murder children lost twice in this election. By all accounts and polls beforehand, this is a miraculous outcome!

There is obviously more work to be done to protect each and every unborn baby in our state and to give mothers in desperate situations life-affirming choices and help, but this is an amazing pro-life victory in Nebraska. Similar pro-life measures have failed in states like Kansas and Ohio, but not in Nebraska. Praise God! Thank you for taking this election to heart and prayer. Thank you for choosing life for our little brothers and sisters.

Veterans Day

Every November 11th, we celebrate Veterans Day. Originally called "Armistice Day", it began on Nov. 11th, 1919, to commemorate the conclusion of World War I. In 1926, the U.S. Congress passed a resolution to observe Armistice Day annually and, in 1938, it became a national holiday. President Dwight D. Eisenhower altered the name of the holiday in 1954 and renamed it "Veterans Day." Other countries also honor their veterans on November 11, such as Great Britain, Australia, Canada, and France.

The U.S. Department for Veterans Affairs defines a veteran as such: "38 U.S.C. § 101(2) provides: The term 'veteran' means a person who served in the active military, naval, or air service, and who was discharged or released therefrom under conditions other than dishonorable." We wish to honor our courageous soldiers of past and present, and to pray for them. Incidentally, Nov. 11th is also the Memorial of St. Martin of Tours, a soldier during the early church and convert to Christianity. St. Martin, pray for our veterans and protect our servicemen and women!

- If you are a recurring giver through ParishSoft, you will be receiving an email shortly regarding the transition to ParishStaq.







Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam Fasting Brothers

in conjunction with Seven Sisters Apostolate For more information, contact the parish office.



Fasting Brothers are men who commit to fasting one day a week in conjunction with their parish's Seven Sisters group (cf. WEARE: SevenSistersApostolate.org) exclusively for the intention of their pastor. Sunday is excluded as it is the Lord's day and thus unsuited to penance.

WHAT

Fasting Brothers each commit to a day of the week (other than Sunday) to offer their fasts in union with the Eucharistic Holy WE DO: Hour of a Seven Sister for their priest, Each man chooses what type of fast he will offer, e.g. no food all day, only bread and water, not eating until 3 p.m.-whatever he discerns from the Holy Spirit. It should be sacrificial.



On the specific day of the week to which he has committed, a Fasting Brother offers his fast solely for the intentions of the WE FAST: pastor. These include: the priest's sanctification in general, specific spiritual and temporal needs, and his ever-deepening devotion to Our Lady, Mother of Priests. These mirror the Seven Sisters' intentions during their Eucharistic Holy Hours. It is also encouraged that the Fasting Brothers offer their fasts for the priest's increased devotion to St. Joseph, model of fortitude and purity.

WHY IT MATTERS:

Holy Mother Church is under attack like never before. Our priests daily face the brunt of Satan's brutal assault. Like officers bravely leading the charge into battle, our priests need the support of the entire Church Militant. Jesus tells us of how to fight the most powerful devils: "But this kind is not cast out but by prayer and fasting" (Matthew 17:21). The Seven Sisters provide the prayer and the Fasting Brothers complement it with their fasts. We need both!

HOW

Identify six men in your parish who are willing to put themselves on the line physically and spiritually for your pastor. Get a TO START: commitment from someone for each day of the week (except Sunday) and invite them to make a one-year commitment. Choose a solemnity on which to renew your commitment each year (such as the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart or Solemnity of Saint Joseph). Let your pastor and your local Seven Sisters group know when you're underway! Godspeed!


