From the Pastor

Christ the King

Today is the last Sunday of the liturgical year and the Solemnity of Christ the King. Rejoice, for Christ is the King of Universe! Among our Spanish-speaking brothers and sisters exists the custom of *el Grito* or *The Shout*. It has many forms, but one form of this distinctive cry emerged from the Cristero war in Mexico. The war occurred in the 1920s in reaction to the enforcement of severe anti-clerical and anti-Catholic laws inscribed in the Mexican constitution of 1917. One of the Saints during the conflict was the martyr, Bl. Miguel Pro, whose feast day was yesterday, Nov. 23.

"¡Viva Cristo Rey!" or "Long live Christ the King!" became the sounding cry of the Mexican faithful and martyrs during this tempestuous time. To this day, Hispanic peoples shout this expression with their priests on special feast days. The priest shouts, "¡Viva Cristo Rey!" and the people all respond, "¡Viva!" It is a perfect motto and exclamation for our parish. May we all shout "¡Viva!" today in gratitude for our Savior and in defense of religious freedom everywhere.

Thanksgiving Mass & Blessing of Foods

Thanksgiving began in November 1621, when Governor William Bradford hosted a feast lasting three days. The celebration commemorated the Pilgrims' first successful harvest of corn. At least ninety Wampanoag Native Americans joined the 52 Englishmen for the occasion. The holiday still brings relatives and families, friends and strangers together in a common meal.

The spirit of Thanksgiving brought different cultures together around one table. It seems most fitting, therefore, that our two parishes of Holy Name and St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament, and our English- and Spanish-speaking communities, gather around one altar, united in the Eucharist and fraternal love. **This year we will host a bilingual Mass on Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 28th, at 9 a.m. in Holy Name Church.** All three choirs

from our parishes' weekend Masses and liturgical ministers from both parishes and communities will take part in this common celebration. I hope you will join us and bring some of the foodstuffs you will serve at your suppers for a special blessing. Please place your food items on the designated table in the Holy Name sanctuary before Mass begins.



in conjunction with Seven Sisters Apostolate For more information, please contact the parish office.

WHO

Fasting Brothers are men who commit to fasting one day a week in conjunction with their parish's Seven Sisters group (cf. WEARE: SevenSistersApostolate.org) exclusively for the intention of their pastor. Sunday is excluded as it is the Lord's day and thus unsuited to penance.

Fasting Brothers each commit to a day of the week (other than WHAT Sunday) to offer their fasts in union with the Eucharistic Holy WE DO: Hour of a Seven Sister for their priest. Each man chooses what type of fast he will offer, e.g. no food all day, only bread and water, not eating until 3 p.m.-whatever he discerns from the Holy Spirit. It should be sacrificial.

On the specific day of the week to which he has committed, a WHY Fasting Brother offers his fast solely for the intentions of the WE FAST: pastor. These include: the priest's sanctification in general, specific spiritual and temporal needs, and his ever-deepening devotion to Our Lady, Mother of Priests. These mirror the Seven Sisters' intentions during their Eucharistic Holy Hours. It is also encouraged that the Fasting Brothers offer their fasts for the priest's increased devotion to St. Joseph, model of fortitude and purity.

Holy Mother Church is under attack like never before. Our priests daily face the brunt of Satan's brutal assault. Like officers MATTERS: bravely leading the charge into battle, our priests need the support of the entire Church Militant. Jesus tells us of how to fight the most powerful devils: "But this kind is not cast out but by prayer and fasting" (Matthew 17:21). The Seven Sisters provide the prayer and the Fasting Brothers complement it with their fasts. We need both!

HOW

WHY IT

Identify six men in your parish who are willing to put themselves on the line physically and spiritually for your pastor. Get a TO START: commitment from someone for each day of the week (except Sunday) and invite them to make a one-year commitment. Choose a solemnity on which to renew your commitment each year (such as the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart or Solemnity of Saint Joseph). Let your pastor and your local Seven Sisters group know when you're underway! Godspeed!



We have successfully concluded our Matching Grant Fund Drive and our cup has runneth over! This Matching Grant will assure us of continuing to answer the many calls for assistance from the individuals and families who find themselves in troubling and too often desperate situations.

We recently were able to help a lady who is unable to work due to cancer treatments and was given an eviction notice. She cares for her adult son who is disabled and was beginning to sell her furniture to pay the rent. We were able to work with her landlord to avoid eviction and along with Together Inc. and HHS get her on a more secure path going forward.

We received a call from a single mother of four young children who had covid/flu and couldn't work for a month. Her MUD was shut off and OPPD was on disconnect notice. We provided her the contact info for the LIHEAP program who got her MUD re-connected and helped her to get caught up on the OPPD bill, which allowed her some breathing room to keep the family together.

The many stories of people and families in need will continue to come in on our call line as we move into the Holiday Season and with the generosity of our St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament Parish community and the Knights of Columbus and our Matching Grant, we will be able to answer the calls and 'Make us responsive to the Christian calling to seek and find the forgotten, the suffering, or the deprived so that we may bring them Your love'.

- If you are a recurring giver through ParishSoft, you will be receiving an email shortly regarding the transition to ParishStaq.


