A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke:

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary

his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted - and you yourself a sword will pierce - so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him. (Lk 2:25-40)



From the Pastor

Feast of the Presentation

The Feast of the Presentation, which takes the place of the 4th Sunday of Ordinary Time today, Feb. 2nd, originated in 4th century Jerusalem. It came to be celebrated in Rome by the middle of the 5th century under its Greek title, $Y\pi\alpha\pi\alpha\nu\tau\dot{\eta}$ or, the "Feast of the Meeting". It is also colloquially known as Candlemas Day because devotional candles used in the home and church are traditionally blessed on this day at the beginning of Mass. In the traditional liturgical calendar, this day marks the end of the Christmas Season; therefore, it also marks the last day our outdoor Christmas lights will be lit.

The feast today itself commemorates the day in which the 40 day-old infant Jesus was presented to the Father at the temple and in which the prophet Simeon declared Christ to be a "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel" (Lk. 2:32). Various Catholic cultures, especially Latino households, keep the spirit of this feast day alive throughout the year as they bring their newborns to church for a special blessing when they are 40 days old.



The Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord

120. Until 1969, the ancient feast of the presentation of Our Lord (130), which is of Oriental origin, was known in the West as the feast of the Purification of Our Lady, and closed the Christmas season, forty days after the Lord's birth. This feast has for long been associated with many popular devotional exercises. The faithful:

- gladly participate in the processions commemorating the Lord's entry into the Temple in Jerusalem and his encounter with God, whose house he had come to for the first time, and then with Simeon and Anna. Such processions, which in the West had taken the place of licentious pagan events, always had a penitential character, and were later identified with the blessing of candles which were carried in procession in honor of Christ, "the light to enlighten the Gentiles" (Lk 2, 32);
- are sensitive to the actions of the Blessed Virgin in presenting her Son in the Temple, and to her submission to the Law of Moses (Lk 12, 1-8) in the rite of purification; popular piety sees in the rite of purification the humility of Our Lady and hence, 2 February has long been regarded as a feast for those in humble service.

Baptism Classes

Our Baptism preparation sessions in English and in Spanish are for expectant parents and for parents with unbaptized infants or small children under the age of 7, along with their potential godparents.

- Classes in English normally occur from 2 p.m.-4 p.m., usually on the First Sunday of every month in the Parish Center (basement) of St. Philip Neri Church.
- Classes in Spanish normally occur every other month on a Sunday from 3 p.m.-6 p.m. in the Holy Name Cafeteria.

Participation in one of our preparation classes, either in Spanish or in English, is necessary to schedule a day and time for a Baptism in either HN or SPN churches. Formal registration and participation in the parish is a prerequisite, and pre-

Mardi Gras Hiatus

In our two months searching for a new parish business manager and my solo management of the two parishes, I, lamentably, have not secured a comprehensive team to coordinate our annual Mardi Gras event, originally slated for March 1st, 2025, only a month from today! I don't want to put together something haphazard or a dinner that fails to match the caliber and quality of previous years just to meet a fast-approaching deadline.

Moreover, in my solicitation for volunteers and discussions with parishioners and school families, it is time to reconsider the event and to take a hiatus this year. Many have worked tirelessly the last few years to put on the event, but they cannot do it alone: We need to figure out new ways to invite and procure new and additional volunteers. Moreover, considering our giant Fall Festival that requires much of the same labor and people, as well as the generosity of the same donors and underwriters, it's appropriate to take a step back and reevaluate the Mardi Gras.

Having said that, our parish and school still need your help. Four years ago, we did not have the Mardi Gras event because of lockdowns, yet we still received the budgeted donations because of your amazing generosity! I am asking you to have that same heart and understanding this year. We need to raise an additional \$60,000 this time of year to fulfill our budget and pay our expenses, so please support our parish and school and contribute. Please give as if you were donating to the Mardi Gras event. The bulk of our Mardi Gras profit and proceeds have always come not from the event itself but from your donations and from underwriters.

This year's theme is "Marriage: Source of Hope, Spring of Renewal. Pursue a Lasting Love!" The observances of


