

From the Pastor

"It's the Most Holiest Time of the Year"

Today the Lord enters Jerusalem triumphant, hailed and saluted by the masses. By Friday, those same crowds will shout for His death. What happened? How fickle can we be in our worship of the Lord, especially when mob mentalities, fear of exclusion, and societal pressure enter the picture?

Holy Week begins today with Palm Sunday. This is the holiest period of the entire Christian Liturgical Year, and the week culminates in the Triduum, consisting of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday/Easter Vigil. How will we walk with Jesus this week, in word only or in spiritual solicitude all the way to Calvary?

For a complete list of our Triduum and Easter Masses and devotions, along with invitations to help decorate and clean our churches for Easter, please see the posters on our churches' bulletin boards. The information is also available on our parish website.

As we continue on our "Journey of Faith" together, uniting our three communities in prayer and worship with a single priest - the SPN-BS English-speaking community and both the HN English-speaking and Spanish-speaking communities — I know you continue to adapt to new realities. Allow me to explain why we have the schedule this week that we do.

There can only be one Mass of the Lord's Supper celebrated on Holy Thursday for a church, and it must be conducted in the evening. I am only one man, a single priest gladly assigned to both of our parishes. Holy Name Church is the logical setting for this single Mass at 7 p.m. since its size accommodates the great numbers from all

three communities. Both of our churches will have altars of repose on Holy Thursday night and all three communities will be included in the bilingual liturgy in Holy Name.

On Good Friday, we are conducting services in both English and Spanish. We will have Stations (12 noon) and the Veneration of the Cross liturgy (3 p.m.) in English at St. Philip Neri Church since the Holy Thursday celebration was conducted in Holy Name Church. We will also have outdoor Stations (6 p.m.) and the Veneration of the Cross liturgy (7 p.m.) in Spanish at Holy Name Church. This ensures celebrations at both churches on Good Friday and respects our cultural diversity and needs.

As part of our Journey of Faith decisions, Holy Name retained the Vigil Mass in English on Saturday evenings and its Mass in Spanish on Sunday afternoons, while St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament retained its Sunday morning Masses

in English. In accord with those decisions, the Easter Sunday morning Masses in English (7:30 a.m. and 10 a.m.) will both occur in St. Philip Neri Church. The Easter Sunday Mass in Holy Name at 12:30 p.m. will occur in Spanish, and the Easter Vigil in English on Saturday night continues to be celebrated in Holy Name Church, albeit later than usual, at 8:45 p.m. This is a gorgeous liturgy in which the Baptisms of English-speaking adults and older children will take place.

The Easter Vigil will be conducted in English because the regular, Saturday evening Mass in Holy Name is celebrated in English and out of consideration for pastoral needs. We always have many children and youth from our Spanish-speaking families receiving all three sacraments of initiation at Easter. The Easter Vigil, while beautiful and appropriate, may not be the ideal setting for children to stay awake throughout it: It begins at 8:45 p.m. and lasts two to three hours. If the Vigil were further celebrated bilingually, it


would become even more complex, lengthy, and unwieldy. We have opted to celebrate these sacraments of initiation in Spanish during the Easter Sunday Mass in Holy Name at 12:30 p.m.

Lastly, the common language of the United States is English and, while liturgies may be celebrated in other languages than our own, the liturgy is the work of God and surpasses our subjective experiences. Masses were conducted in Latin throughout the whole world for centuries, a "dead" language that few people could speak or understand, but they attended Mass nonetheless out of their love for Jesus, not out of personal convenience or preferences. I know it is hard to change, and I know that these locations and languages for our liturgies may not be ideal for you personally

- they are different than what you have long experienced in your parishes growing up or even countries of origin.

Even if you do not agree with the reasoning for these changes, I hope you see that there has been careful thought and consultation to develop this plan. More importantly, I encourage you to seek the good in these changes. They allow us to leave our comfort zones, offer generous sacrifices, and seek the unity that Christ Himself desires, after all, it is Him that we are celebrating this week, is it not? We can look at these changes as "losses" and envy what others "got", or we can be glad for others and thankful for ourselves and see these changes as new, graced opportunities to meet Jesus. You are beautiful, hospitable, and faithful people. I pray for you, my spiritual families, and I look forward to being with you throughout this most Holy Week.





Fasting & Abstinence from Meat

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 should fast on this Good Friday, April 18th. Fasting consists of eating one full meal and two smaller meals during the day, without snacking. If one cannot do this for legitimate health reasons, he or she is exempt. Those ages 14 and older are required to refrain from eating meat on Good Friday, too.

Lenten Abstinence from Meat

Those aged 14 and older are required to refrain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. There are no exceptions to this expectation.

Parish Office Closure for Easter

In honor of the Triduum and Easter itself, the Parish Offices at both parishes will be closed Good Friday and Easter Monday (April 18th-21st). We regret any inconvenience.

No Regular Masses

Please be mindful that there is no 6:30 p.m. Mass in Spanish in HN Church this Holy Thursday (April 17th) and no 8:15 a.m. morning Mass in SPN Church this Good Friday (April 18th).

Altars of Repose & Exposition on Holy Thursday & Good Friday

In accord with liturgical law, there is no exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, however, there is still Eucharistic adoration on Holy Thursday evening. We encourage everyone to spend some time with Christ in the Blessed Sacrament on this Holy Thursday night, April 17th, between 8 p.m.— and 12 midnight, in both HN and SPN churches. The altar of repose in SPN Church will be located on the side altar dedicated to Mary in the south transept of the church. The altar of repose in HN Church will be located on the side altar dedicated to St. Joseph in the south transept of the church.

In addition to spending some time in our churches, Holy Name and St. Philip Neri, it is a Catholic custom to visit and briefly pray at the altars of repose at a total of seven churches on Holy Thursday night. Call other churches ahead and make your plans now. Some nearby churches are Sacred Heart, St. Benedict the Moor, St. John (Creighton), St. Mary Magdalene, St. Peter, Immaculate Conception, Our Lady of Lourdes, St. Cecilia Cathedral, St. Bernard, St. James, and St. John the Baptist (Fort Calhoun).

Holy Saturday Morning Prayer & Blessing of Easter Baskets and Foods

All are invited to take part in the chanted Office of Readings & Morning Prayer in English on Holy Saturday, April 19th at 9 a.m. in SPN Church. The Office of Readings, or *Matins*, and Morning Prayer, *Lauds*, come from the Liturgy of the Hours prayed by clergy, consecrated persons, and the laity. Moreover, all are invited to bring to the service some food that will be served at their own homes for Easter dinner. These foods in baskets and all other Easter Baskets will be blessed at the end of the service. All foods to be blessed should be placed on the table provided in the church.

Baptism Classes

Our Baptism preparation sessions in English and in Spanish are for expectant parents and for parents with unbaptized infants or small children under the age of 7, along with their potential godparents.

- Classes in English normally occur from 2 p.m.-4 p.m., usually on the First Sunday of every month in the Parish Center (basement) of St. Philip Neri Church.
- Classes in Spanish normally occur every other month on a Sunday from 3 p.m.-6 p.m. in the Holy Name Cafeteria.

Participation in one of our preparation classes, either in Spanish or in English, is necessary to schedule a day and time for a Baptism in either HN or SPN churches. Formal registration and participation in the parish is a prerequisite, and pre-registration is further required to attend the class. Please contact the secretary of your respective parish office, Holy Name or St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament, to determine future classes and to pre-register.




Holy Thursday and Good Friday, April 17-18

If persons cannot do this for health reasons, they are exempt. All those 14 and older are required to refrain from eating meat on Good Friday. There are no exemptions to abstinence from meat.


