#### The Resurrection of the Lord - The Mass of Easter Day

Acts 10:34a, 37-43 Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23 Colossians 3:1-4 John 20:1-9

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 24:1-12

At daybreak on the first day of the week the women who had come from Galilee with Jesus took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb; but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were puzzling over this, behold, two men in dazzling garments appeared to them. They were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground. They said to them, "Why do you seek the living one among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised. Remember what he said to you while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners and be crucified, and rise on the third day." And they remembered his words. Then they returned from the tomb and announced all these things to the eleven and to all the others. The women were Mary Magdalene, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James; the others who accompanied them also told this to the apostles, but their story seemed like nonsense and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb, bent down, and saw the burial cloths alone; then he went home amazed at what had happened.



of Omaha and marks the 50th anniversary of his priestly ordination. A light reception will follow in the gym.

will be installed as the sixth Archbishop of Omaha on Wednesday, May 7th, at 2 p.m. in St. Cecilia Cathedral. #### Easter Joy!

"Christ is risen!" "Christ is truly risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!" This is the familiar and traditional greeting echoing among Christians today. The simple word, Alleluia, which means "praise the Lord", has returned! What cause to celebrate! Death and the fear of death have been swallowed up; they have been cast down beneath the triumphant Resurrection of Christ! All sins can be forgiven through Him Who loves us. All doors to grace have been opened. We are no longer slaves, but sons and daughters of God who can victoriously and confidently declare the Lord to be our Father! May you and yours have a most blessed Easter Sunday and Easter Octave. Remember, Easter day continues for the next eight days.

#### **Continue Your Easter Celebration at Home!**

The Son of God made His home with us in His flesh. He was born of an earthly mother, raised by a trusted foster father, celebrated His final meal with His closest friends, and, risen from the dead, appeared to those same Apostles in that same dwelling place. The Lord has a deep fondness for the family and domestic life. May these simple devotions and activities permeate your home and assist you, your family, and your band of friends to enter more deeply into the Mysteries of Easter.

**Remember Your Baptisms:** Display pictures of family baptisms or watch videos of them. Dig out the white garment and candle used for the sacrament. Ask your parents about your baptism day. Tell your children about their baptism day, e.g., was the gown used in the baptism an heirloom used by many in the family or unique to the person?

The "A" Word: See how many times you can use the word "Alleluia" in conversation today.

Wear Some White: Early Christians would commemorate their baptisms and reveal their Christian dignity by wearing white clothes throughout the entire Easter Season and especially on Pentecost, known as Whitsunday. Today, wear as many white clothes as you can or wear something new or different to remind you of your baptismal garments and new beginnings and Resurrection in Christ.

#### **Baptism Classes**

Our Baptism preparation sessions in English and in Spanish are for expectant parents and for parents with unbaptized infants or small children under the age of 7, along with their potential godparents.

- **Classes in English** normally occur from 2 p.m.-4 p.m., usually on the First Sunday of every month in the Parish Center (basement) of St. Philip Neri Church.
- Classes in Spanish normally occur every other month on a Sunday from 3 p.m.-6 p.m. in the Holy Name Cafeteria.

Participation in one of our preparation classes, either in Spanish or in English, is necessary to schedule a day and time for a Baptism in either HN or SPN churches. Formal registration and participation in the parish is a prerequisite, and pre-registration is further required to attend the class.
