# Memorial Day Mass at Forest Lawn Cemetery

On Memorial Day tomorrow we commemorate the brave men and women who died serving and protecting our country in military service. Originally, it was called Decoration Day and began

after the Civil War. It commemorated the Union soldiers who died. Since World War I, however, the celebration has expanded its scope. It has become a day to honor all U.S. soldiers who have died in wars and in the service of our country.

This year's celebration is particularly personal for me. My father, William "Bill" S. Cook, died 45 years ago on May 26<sup>th</sup>. Memorial Day fell on May 26<sup>th</sup> in 1980 just like it is occurring on May 26th this year. My dad was a veteran but didn't die in combat. Early on in his life, he served in the Navy. With his physics degree from Creighton, he worked on secret weapons. An injury in an accident on the aircraft carrier on which he served ' ended his military career. He came home, got further

degrees in electrical engineering, married my mom, and eventually had us kids.

I miss my dad and am proud of his service to our country. I am humbled by all the generous men and women who have protected us and our freedoms, and I am honored to offer Mass for them tomorrow. I hope you will join me in praying for them.

SPN-BS Parish has had a long tradition of offering Mass in the Historic Chapel of Forest Lawn Cemetery on Memorial Day. All are invited to attend this special liturgy in English tomorrow, Monday, May 26<sup>th</sup>, at 9 a.m. Because of security concerns, the only available entrance to Forest Lawn Cemetery tomorrow is by way of Mormon Bridge Road. Once inside the cemetery, follow the signs for the Historic Chapel. The chapel seats 70-75 comfortably and programs will be passed out.

Eternal rest grant onto them, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

#### **Ascension Thursday**

On the fortieth day after Easter Sunday, Jesus Christ ascended into Heaven to sit at the right hand of His Father. Where He goes, He wishes to lead and take us. The SVDP Society has just completed the first quarter of 2025 in which we received over 100 calls for assistance! We provided help with utility bills, rent, food, and household goods. One particular request was from a single mother of three who was relocating due to an abusive situation and just needed the basics to start over. We were able to partner with the NE Department of Health, All Communities Outreach, and the Food Pantry to help the family get caught up on their utilities and move forward one step at a time.

Many of the situations that we encounter in the calls for assistance are complicated and involve our SVDP volunteers teaming up with other agencies in our area to help resolve the problems the families are facing. We can be *The* solution or many times a *Part* of the solution, but either way we can offer prayers and support to those who call St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament in their time of need.

As we celebrate the Easter Season and the Resurrection of Jesus we are especially thankful for the prayers and support we receive from our Parish Family - we could not do this alone! Please continue to help us on our Mission of Charity and also in our support of the Holy Name Food Pantry. Canned goods, pasta, and breakfast cereal are popular items requested and the need is always growing. Since the beginning of January we have contributed over 52 sacks and 12 large and small boxes of groceries to the pantry!






