The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity - June 15, 2025 - Proverbs 8:22-31 Psalm 8:4-9 Romans 5:1-5 John 16:12-15

Lectio Divina (https://catholic.bible/lectio-divina-in-english/) **Reading (Lectio)** Read the Holy Gospel two or three times. John 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming. He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you."

Meditation (Meditatio) After reading the Gospel, reflect in silence on one or more of the following questions:

- What word or words in the passage caught your attention?
- What in this passage comforted you?
- What in this passage challenged you?

Prayer (Oratio) Read the Scripture passage one more time. Bring to the Lord the praise, petition, or thanksgiving that His Word inspires in you.

Contemplation (*Contemplatio***)** What conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me?

"I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now." What Church teachings do I struggle to understand? How can I grow in docility and humility?

"The Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth." How do I witness to the truth by the way I love? How can I speak the truth in love?

"He will glorify me." How can I glorify the Lord by my life? How can I nurture the gift of awe in God's presence?

How can I make my life a gift for others in charity? Read a papal encyclical or listen to a homily by Pope Leo XIV. Identify an action you can take to give glory to God. (www.vatican.va/holy_father/index.htm).

Father's Day

Fatherhood is a precious gift and a challenging, difficult vocation to live fully. Every papa, dad, father, abba, papi, pepaw, grandfather, and godfather needs our prayers. Today we acknowledge, celebrate, and intercede for all fathers, living and deceased:

- To those papas anticipating the birth of a child and families grown by adoption we celebrate you
- To those dads raising and rearing their little ones every day we appreciate you
- To those who lived through driving tests, medical tests, and the overall testing of fatherhood - we are better for having you in our midst

Solemnity of the Trinity

Today, nestled between the solemnities of Pentecost and Corpus Christi, is a celebration of the heart of our Faith: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Trinity is composed of three distinct Divine Persons Who are all equally one God. Three in one, one in three? The Trinity certainly defies our experience of physics, but God, Who created physics, is beyond physics.

The Trinity is a true mystery but one we can intuitively understand through a participation in love. Like the Trinity Itself, love unites separate persons into a shared oneness. If God is love, and we are made in His image, then we are created for relationship: We are made to be loved and to love.

Analogies about the Trinity will always fall short, but we can view glimpses of Him in unions of love: families, married couples, and friendship. "Praise the Holy Trinity, undivided unity, Holy God, Mighty God, God Immortal be adored."

Recipients of the Spirit of St. Philip Neri Award



Bernie Nancy and Bohnenkamp married each other in St. Philip Neri Church in 1972, but their connection to the parish began long before then. Nancy was born and raised in the parish; she grew up with her family in Ponca Hills on North Post Road. After their wedding, Bernie and Nancy would walk to Mass. They lived in an apartment above the

hardware store near Zesto's. Since then, they have continued to be members of our parish. "There has never been anywhere else for us," Nancy remarks. She continues: "We still know so many people that we've known for so many years. We like being part of the stability here. It's our foundation. It is just our home." Bernie and Nancy brought up four lovely children in the parish: Cecilia, Matt, Andy, and Jeanie. They, in turn, have produced 13 dear grandchildren, most of whom are also growing up in our parish.

You'll find Bernie and Nancy side by side attending the 7:30 a.m. Sunday Mass and daily Mass on Fridays. He is the epitome of manly and fatherly stability and protection, and she embodies the infectious joy, firmness, and tenderness of the maternal heart. They abundantly live out their Catholic Faith and their love of the Eucharist. Nancy explains their mutual devotion to the Lord: "We owe Him so much. It's a humility thing... We are so ridiculously blessed." Both live their faith in and outside of the church building.

For many years, Bernie has been an ardent, active member in our Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, which provides outreach to our neighbors in need. Currently, he serves as our conference's president. You'll see him after Mass on Fridays emptying the two boxes in our church that collect food donations, as well as setting out the blue barrels for coats and leading other donation drives and monthly meetings throughout the year. Bernie is the kind of guy who, when he sees a person in need, especially people who have lost a loved one, jumps in and helps them get through their distress, tackling their next steps, their finances and other looming burdens. He shares his organizational gifts with others and helps bring order to our often chaotic and hurting world.

Nancy, since she recently retired from owning and running Harold's Koffee House with her son, Matt, has been more active assisting at our funeral lunches, providing comfort to those in mourning. Nancy has helped in so many ways at the parish. She served on our parish's Pastoral Council for many terms. When her children were in St. Philip Neri Catholic School, she served as a room mother and

chaperone for students' outings, and she was a member of the school board for multiple terms. Meanwhile, Bernie was active in the athletic association and was a coach many times over. Both Bernie and Nancy generously participated in the efforts and campaign to build the Activity Center that has been such a blessing to our students and parish.

Nancy's charity spills outside of our parish and school. Most of you know the nearby treasure of Harold's Koffee House. Nancy's father began the local diner, and she continued its management after his passing. It is more than a business in Florence; it is a locus for the community, a conduit for friendship, and a kind of ministry for the neglected and those starting new chapters in their lives. This is why Nancy and her son Matt poured their blood and sweat into operating the restaurant. It was a vital place for nourishment not only of body, but of the soul. Nancy comments, "It's the reason why we were there." Nancy is also involved in other apostolates throughout the city, such as her pro-life efforts, where she offers her motherly tenderness and encouragement as a sidewalk counsellor, providing hope and alternatives for vulnerable mothers and their unborn children.



Nancy and her dear friend and fellow parishioner, Peg Ricketts, started Our Lady's Prayer Group in the late 70s, meeting at church once a week and now at Scooter's. Though some members have grown infirm, they continue to pray for family concerns and worldly affairs. Nancy and Peg were quite a team: They also put on the Two-by-Two ministry in the parish

and started the Prayer Box up at school, a tradition that continues today. Our students place their intentions in the Prayer Box and on Fridays Nancy prays for these students and their requests. (*Continued on next page.*)

The SVDP Society has just completed the first quarter of 2025 in which we received over 100 calls for assistance! We provided help with utility bills, rent, food, and household goods. One particular request was from a single mother of three who was relocating due to an abusive situation and just needed the basics to start over. We were able to partner with the NE Department of Health, All Communities Outreach, and the Food Pantry to help the family get caught up on their utilities and move forward one step at a time.

Many of the situations that we encounter in the calls for assistance are complicated and involve our SVDP volunteers teaming up with other agencies in our area to help resolve the problems the families are facing. We can be *The* solution or many times a *Part* of the solution, but either way we can offer prayers and support to those who call St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament in their time of need.

As we celebrate the Easter Season and the Resurrection of Jesus we are especially thankful for the prayers and support we receive from our Parish Family - we could not do this alone! Please continue to help us on our Mission of Charity and also in our support of the Holy Name Food Pantry. Canned goods, pasta, and breakfast cereal are popular items requested and the need is always growing. Since the beginning of January we have contributed over 52 sacks and 12 large and small boxes of groceries to the pantry!
