From the Pastor

Pentecost

Today, this 50th dav of Pentecost, Easter, is venerated as the birthday of the Catholic Church, and, as her members, it is our birthday as well. Though Pentecost concludes the Easter Season (Eastertide), its mystery deserves contemplation and gratitude. I hope these words from the preacher to the papal household, Fr. Raniero Cantalamessa, O.F.M. Cap., might assist and inspire your prayer.



"Pentecost was an event in the subjective order, an experience. The shift, from the slave-heart full of fear to the filial heart, brimming with love, is not something that can happen without the one to whom it happens being aware of it; it is not the kind of heart transplant that is done under general anesthetics! On the contrary, the experience of the love of God was one of overwhelming intensity for the apostles: to be loved by God, and to love God in return! They were literally inundated, 'baptized,' in love. That was what moved them so much that they were beside themselves, to such an extent that people thought them drunk (see Acts 2:13). The sudden change in the apostles cannot be explained in any other way; it was the fire of divine love itself that flared up in them. What they did on that occasion are the sort of things that only love moves one to do. The apostles, as the martyrs would be later on, were in effect 'drunk,' but 'drunk on love that came to them through the finger of God which is the Holy Spirit.' Drunk because 'drenched in the torrent of divine delights'; drunk with that sober inebriation that does death to sins and gives life to the heart...

Every time someone has a genuine, strong experience of the Spirit, the most vivid memory of the moment that the person retains is of an intense perception of the Father's love. Witnessing to this, someone said: 'All my life long, I had felt unloved. The next day, that feeling vanished entirely. I felt myself immersed in a new experience of the love of God, and from that day it has never left me.'

This is the most beautiful moment of any creature's life: to know that one is loved, personally, by God, to feel oneself lifted to the bosom of the Trinity and to find oneself in the flood of love that flows between Father and Son, enfolded in their love, sharing their passionate love for the world. And all of this in one instant, without any need to think about it or for words to say it. 'Amazing condescension of the Creator toward the creature, signal grace, inconceivable benevolence, the greatest of motives for the creature to trust the Creator, sweet closeness shared, delight of mutual knowing; we come to find ourselves clasped in the embrace and sharing the kiss of Father and Son, and that is the Holy Spirit; united to God with the same love that unites Father and Son, made holy in him who is the very holiness of the Two. To rejoice in such a great good, to have the sweet experience of it, as far as it is possible in this troubled and deceptive lifetime: that is to experience what it is truly to be alive' (William of Saint Thierry, Mirror of Faith)."

May we strive to make the prayer penned by Pope Paul VI our own: "Lord, let me be open to a perennial Pentecost – a daily outpouring of your Holy Spirit – your gift of transforming love. Let my life be transformed by your Spirit and let my actions reflect this transformation." Amen.

Pentecost Fun

Thanks to all of you for accepting the playful invitation to dress in as much white clothing as possible for our Pentecost Masses today. You just took part in the ancient Catholic custom that originated the *Whitsunday* nickname for Pentecost. I hope the visual impact of seeing many of your fellow parishioners arrayed in white unleashed some joy in your heart, deeper faith in the Lord, and remembrance of the Christian dignity that was given to you in Baptism, the moment when you were clothed in Christ through the Holy Spirit!

According to the Meriam-Webster Dictionary online, *Whitsunday* is another name for Pentecost. It comes from the 12th Century "Old English *hwīta sunnandæg*, literally 'white Sunday'; probably so called from the fact that at this season there were many people who were newly baptized and who wore white robes." While clergy in the West now wear red vestments on Pentecost, some Christian traditions continue a longstanding and older practice: In Ireland and the U.K., even the clergy celebrate the liturgy in white vestments on Pentecost. The liturgical color of white reminds us of the Holy Spirit in the form of the dove that descended upon Jesus in His Baptism and represents our own baptismal dignity. You can even keep wearing your white clothes throughout the day; after all, it is after Memorial Day.

The Return of Our Church's Tabernacle

Just in time for the birthday of the Catholic Church on Pentecost Sunday, our church's original tabernacle has returned, along with the processional cross and all accompanying candlesticks adorning the high and low altars. They look exquisite and have all been gilded anew by Koley's Inc., located here in Omaha. We are so grateful to the donors who made these amazing refurbishments possible.

The poles that originally existed in and on our tabernacle to hold veils were lost with time, but the tabernacle has been repaired and refitted with these necessary rods. In respect for the majesty of the Eucharist, tabernacles were customarily fitted with internal and external coverings - veils or curtains. We use these veils because every tabernacle is patterned upon the Holy of Holies in the ancient Jewish temple. The curtains in the ancient temple were miraculously torn in two during the crucifixion of Jesus. Now the veils that once separated us from the Most High are rendered asunder each time our Eucharistic Jesus comes from the tabernacle to be with His people in Holy Communion and Adoration. The parting of the curtains reveals the revelation of our Savior and Heaven kissing earth!

The veil inside the tabernacle also reminds us of the hidden life of Jesus, while the exterior veil protects our modesty when coming before God. It is a reminder of the "already but not yet" reality so prevalent in our Christian experience: We are already in the presence of God and being transformed and loved by Him, but we are not yet in Heaven to behold the fullness of His glory. I am working with a seamstress to provide high quality curtains for our tabernacle.

To keep our processional cross and candlesticks in pristine condition, Koley's recommends that our servers and sacristans use white cotton gloves when handling them, so we are procuring these, as well.

The SVDP Society has just completed the first quarter of 2025 in which we received over 100 calls for assistance! We provided help with utility bills, rent, food, and household goods. One particular request was from a single mother of three who was relocating due to an abusive situation and just needed the basics to start over. We were able to partner with the NE Department of Health, All Communities Outreach, and the Food Pantry to help the family get caught up on their utilities and move forward one step at a time.

Many of the situations that we encounter in the calls for assistance are complicated and involve our SVDP volunteers teaming up with other agencies in our area to help resolve the problems the families are facing. We can be *The* solution or many times a *Part* of the solution, but either way we can offer prayers and support to those who call St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament in their time of need.

As we celebrate the Easter Season and the Resurrection of Jesus we are especially thankful for the prayers and support we receive from our Parish Family - we could not do this alone! Please continue to help us on our Mission of Charity and also in our support of the Holy Name Food Pantry. Canned goods, pasta, and breakfast cereal are popular items requested and the need is always growing.
