The Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - July 13, 2025

Deuteronomy 30: 10-14 Psalm 69 or Psalm 19:8-11 Colossians 1: 15-20 Luke 10: 25-37

Today's Holy Gospel: St. Luke 10: 25-37

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test Jesus and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live."

But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. They stripped and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down that road, but when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to

the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

Meditation *After reading the Gospel, reflect in silence on one or more of the following questions:*

What word or words in the passage caught your attention? What in this passage comforted you? What in this passage challenged you?

Prayer Read the Scripture passage again. Bring to the Lord the praise, petition, or thanksgiving the Word inspires in you.

Contemplation What conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me?

- "And who is my neighbor?" Who do I regard as my neighbor? Who am I omitting from this company?
- "But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight." What experiences or causes move me to compassion? How do I act on those feelings?
- *"The one who treated him with mercy."* Who has treated me with mercy? Who needs my merciful treatment this week?

Annual Missionary Appeal Weekend

This year we warmly welcome the missionary apostolate of Ad Gentes and Fr. Through ministries in education, healthcare, counseling, youth empowerment, and community development, they support those on the margins of society—especially immigrants, displaced persons, and refugees. They also stand in solidarity with Christian minorities living in predominantly Islamic regions, offering accompaniment and pastoral care.

We must attend Mass anyway, so why not help in this special outreach that unites our parish and touches the hearts of those who cannot join us physically? Baptism Classes

Formal registration and participation in the parish is a prerequisite, and pre-registration is further required to attend the class. The SVDP Society has just completed the first quarter of 2025 in which we received over 100 calls for assistance! We provided help with utility bills, rent, food, and household goods. One particular request was from a single mother of three who was relocating due to an abusive situation and just needed the basics to start over. We were able to partner with the NE Department of Health, All Communities Outreach, and the Food Pantry to help the family get caught up on their utilities and move forward one step at a time.

Many of the situations that we encounter in the calls for assistance are complicated and involve our SVDP volunteers teaming up with other agencies in our area to help resolve the problems the families are facing. We can be *The* solution or many times a *Part* of the solution, but either way we can offer prayers and support to those who call St. Philip Neri-Blessed Sacrament in their time of need.

We are especially thankful for the prayers and support we receive from our Parish Family - we could not do this alone! Please continue to help us on our Mission of Charity and also in our support of the Holy Name Food Pantry. Canned goods, pasta, and breakfast cereal are popular items requested and the need is always growing. Since the beginning of January we have contributed over 52 sacks and 12 large & small boxes of groceries to the pantry!
